Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of DB Pirates Limited set out on pages 6 to 12, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 May 2019, and the income statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements including a summary of significant accounting policies.

REPORTING ENTITY

DB Pirates Limited ("the Company") is a private company incorporated in Hong Kong with limited liability by guarantee and not having a share capital. In event of the Company being wound up, each member is liable for an amount up to HK\$1. The Company's registered office is located at Unit 20, 1/F., Office Block Two, 96 Siena Avenue, Discovery Bay North, Hong Kong. The Company is engaged in promotion of playing, coaching, refereeing and study of netball, hockey, dragon boating and rugby.

1. BASIS OF PRESENTATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Company qualifies for the reporting exemption as a small private limited by guarantee company under section 359(1)(a) of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. The Company is therefore entitled to prepare and present its financial statements in accordance with the Small and Medium-sized Entity Financial Reporting Standard (the "SME-FRS") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

These financial statements comply with the SME-FRS and have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting and on the basis that the Company is a going concern. The measurement base adopted is the historical cost convention.

The following are the specific accounting policies that are necessary for a proper understanding of the financial statements:

(a) Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and when the revenue can be measured reliably on the following basis:

(i) Membership fee and sponsorship income

Membership fee and sponsorship income are recognised on cash receipt basis;

(ii) Bank interest income

Bank interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis, taking into account the principals outstanding and the rates applicable.

(b) Income tax

Income tax charge, if any, represents current tax expense. The income tax payable, if any, represents the amounts expected to be paid to the taxation authority, using tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax is not provided.

1. BASIS OF PRESENTATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

The depreciable amount of an item of property, plant and equipment is allocated on a systematic basis over its estimated useful life using the straight line method. The principal annual rate used for depreciation is as follows:

Furniture and fixtures and equipment 20%

(d) Account receivables

Accounts receivables are stated at estimated realisable value after each debt has been considered individually. Where the payment of a debt becomes doubtful, an allowance is made and charged to the income statement.

(e) Foreign exchange

Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies at the end of the financial year are translated into Hong Kong Dollars at approximately the market rates of exchange ruling at the reporting date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into Hong Kong Dollars at exchange rates ruling at the transaction dates. Gains and losses arising on exchange are dealt with in the income statement.

(f)Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate of the amount can be made. Where the Company expects a provision to be reimbursed, the reimbursement is recognised as a separate asset but only when the reimbursement is virtually certain.

(g) Impairment of assets

An assessment is made at the end of the financial period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment or reversal of previous impairment, including items of property, plant and equipment. In the event that an asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount, the carrying amount is reduced to recoverable amount and an impairment loss is recognised in the income statement. A previously recognised impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount, however not to an amount higher than the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of amortisation or depreciation), had no impairment losses been recognised for the asset in prior years.

1. BASIS OF PRESENTATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(h) Retirement benefit costs

The Company's contributions to a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Hong Kong Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (the "MPF" Scheme) are expensed as incurred. The Company's employer contributions vest fully with the employees when contributed into the MPF Scheme.
